



Senate Committee Action

Criminal Law

Sentencing hearing (SB 2557): Allows the chief judge of the circuit to permit a personal appearance by two-way audio-visual communication at a sentencing hearing for a defendant who is serving imprisoned for another offense.

Unclaimed bail deposit (SB 3256): Clarifies the original intent of the Bail Reform Act of 2017 was that the \$30 credit applies to the bail (100%) rather than the bail bond (10%).

Auxiliary State policemen (SB 3263): Prohibits the Director of State Police from appointing auxiliary State policemen after the law goes into effect.

Adult Redeploy Illinois (SB 3388): Expands eligibility for Adult Redeploy Illinois to all probation-eligible offenders subject to local control and decision making. This means that local programs would have the option (but not a mandate) to screen and enroll individuals for offenses that are probation-eligible but currently considered violent such as aggravated battery or domestic battery.

Sexual violence (SB 3404): Amends the Preventing Sexual Violence in Education Act. Higher education institutions policies must include an amnesty provision that provides immunity for any student who reports an alleged violation of the higher education institution's comprehensive policy to include possession or use of a controlled substance. Requires that every hospital providing emergency and forensic services to sexual assault survivors provide after a medical evidentiary or physical examination, access to a shower at no cost, unless showering facilities are unavailable. Provides criminal amnesty for alcohol and drug offense for someone reporting the commission of a sexual assault if certain prerequisites are met. Consenting to an Illinois State Police Sexual Assault Evidence Collection Kit under the Sexual Assault

Survivors Emergency Treatment Act is considered reporting to law enforcement authorities as it pertains to the extended statute of limitations.

Stalking No Contact Order (SB 3411): Amends the Stalking No Contact Order Act. Provides that stalking behavior includes sending unwanted messages via social media. Changes the definition of "course of conduct," "conduct," "petitioner," and "stalking." Expands who may bring a petition under the Act to include an authorized agent of a workplace; an authorized agent of a place of worship; and an authorized agent of a school. Provides that a stalking no contact order may require a respondent to submit to a mental health evaluation or wear an electronic monitoring device.

Child support arrearage (SB 3513): Stays a driver's license suspension for child support arrearage for up to 12 months with periodic stay order reviews every 90 days to determine compliance with child support payments and attempts to find employment.

Education

Ag Ed Task Force (SB 2648): Extends date for Ag Ed Task Force to submit findings on 1-1-21 and repeals task force on 2-1-21.

Influenza Vaccine (SB 2654): Requires IDPH to develop informational materials for schools on flu and meningococcal disease and vaccinations. Requires school boards to include the info to parents and guardians.

Third Party Sub (SB 2838): Requires ISBE to implement a program for schools to use recruiting firms for subs.

Math & Science Academy Tuition (SB 2939): Allows IMSA to accept out of state residents and to charge them tuition and room and board.

Student Record Security Breach (SB 3201):

Requires schools to notify parents within 48 hours of the discovery of a breach of student information.

Apprentice Program (SB 3226): Creates new industry-based apprenticeship program for students 16 and older.

Report Card (SB 3236): Requires school report cards to contain up to date information on school administrative costs.

LGBT Instruction (SB 3249): Mandates LGBT history instruction, curriculum, and non-discriminatory and accurate textbooks.

Human Services

Medicaid Reimbursement for FQHC Employed Dental Hygienists (SB 2491): Authorizes licensed dental hygienists working under the supervision of a dentist and employed by a federally qualified health center (FQHC) to be reimbursed for dental services provided to Medicaid recipients at the FQHC encounter rate.

Medicaid Reimbursement for FQHC Employed Dental Hygienists (SB 2839): Authorizes licensed dental hygienists working under the supervision of a dentist and employed by a federally qualified health center (FQHC) to be reimbursed for dental services provided to Medicaid recipients at the FQHC encounter rate.

DHS-Release Personal ID Card (SB 2903): Requires the Secretary of State to issue standard Illinois Identification cards and limited-term Illinois Identification Cards to persons conditional release absolute discharge from DHS custody with specified requirements.

DHS Online Registry for Recovery Residences (SB 3117): Establishes a registry for non-licensed recovery residences to serve as a referral resource for individuals seeking continued recovery assistance. Recovery residences are peer-run homes for individuals transitioning into sober living that do not provide any DHS licensed or funded services. The registry will be encouraged but voluntary, and publicly available. It will highlight

attributes of recovery residences such as endorsement by a third-party, any special programming and location in order to assist providers and individuals looking for alcohol and drug free housing options with like-minded residents who are committed to alcohol and drug-free living.

Child Death Investigation Task Force - Statutory Cleanup (SB 3223): Repeals language in the Child Death Review Team Act that creates the Child Death Investigation Task Force and places revised language into the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act. It moves the Task Force from the Child Death Review Team Act to the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act because the Task Force (since it is no longer a pilot program) is no longer funded through the Child Death Review Teams.

Workforce Training and Healthy Families

Demonstration Project (SB 3232): Creates a five-year demonstration project within DHS to provide an intensive workforce training program for entry level workers and a multi-generational healthy family initiative to be implemented by July 1, 2019. The total number of participants may not exceed 500. Requires the demonstration project to be funded by a private source and operated by a non-profit community based entity who will provide the majority of the wages earned by participants enrolled in the program as well as support services to families, including new and expectant parents enrolled in the initiative.

CILA Fire Inspection Mandate (SB 3535): Requires the State Fire Marshall to provide necessary fire inspections to comply with licensing requirements. Authorizes the Fire Marshall to enter into an agreement with another State agency to conduct the inspection if qualified personnel are employed by the State agency. Provides assurance that a local authority with jurisdiction is authorized to conduct local code inspections.

Judiciary

Life Insurance Distribution (SB 2437): Invalidates any beneficiary designation to a former spouse at the time of the dissolution of marriage. The intent is to reduce cases where a life insurance policy owner forgets to change their beneficiary after a divorce and upon death their ex-spouse is able to claim the proceeds from the policy.

Prairie Wind Trail Property Transfer (SB 2520):

Amends the Prairie Wind Trail Property Transfer Act by changing the date of accepting transfers of land by the Secretary of State Index Department to December 31, 2018.

ABLE Provision Changes (SB 2660): Amends the State Treasurer Act in the section detailing ABLE accounts. States that unless prohibited by federal law, when a designated beneficiary dies the account proceeds may be transferred to the estate or account of another individual specified by the designated beneficiary. The State may not seek payment under subsection (f) of the Federal 529A Internal Revenue Code. A court or a person with a disability may assign "resources" including property, maintenance, and child support to that person's ABLE account or a discretionary trust that complies with Medicaid reimbursements.

5 Percent Limit on Retainage Contract (SB 3052): The Contractor Prompt Payment Act is amended so that construction contract may only have a withholding of 5 percent for progress payment or final payment. Any contract that allows more than 5 percent would be against public policy and unenforceable.

Removing Mobile Homes (SB 3261): Amends the Abandoned Mobile Home Act by removing and deleting language authorizing municipalities and local governments to remove and dispose of abandoned mobile home. Replaces language giving mobile home owners power to enact proceedings to remove abandoned mobile homes.

Pleadings Under Oath (SB 3295): Amends the Code of Civil Procedure in the section for verification and document certification so that any pleading, affidavit, or other document can be used without being sworn under oath removes the any requirement that it be sworn before an authorized person.

Notary Public Investigation (SB 3443): Amends the Illinois Notary Public Act so that the Secretary of State may now reprimand, suspend, and revoke the commission of a notary public. The Secretary of State may investigate violations of the Act committed by a notary public. A notary public is required to cooperate with an investigation and if

suspended must surrender their notary public seal to the Secretary of State.

Illinois Commerce Commission Cleanup (SB 3504):

Amends the Collateral Recovery Act of 1934 by adding cleanup language from the Illinois Commerce Commission.

Transferring Property to Bensenville (SB 3543):

Transfers 12 acres of property from the Illinois Department of Transportation to the Village of Bensenville.

Public Health

Water Management Plans (SB 272): FA 2: deletes all and becomes the bill. Maintains language from FA 1 adding Veterans Homes to the definition of facilities requiring a water management and legionella sampling plan. Facilities must develop a Water Management Plan for Illinois Veterans' Homes, Dept. of Corrections Facilities and Mental Health and Development Disabilities Facilities.

Mammography Information (SB 2442): Requires mammogram providers to give written notifications to mammogram patients with "dense breast tissue."

Unused Antibiotics Disposal (SB 2524): Requires the Department of Public Health and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency to review and recommend new laws for the disposal of unused antibiotics.

Free HPV Vaccinations for Uninsured (SB 2866): Requires the Department of Public Health to provide free human-papillomavirus (HPV) vaccinations to male children under 18 who lack insurance or who are not entitled to receive free-HPV vaccinations from their insurance providers. The change will go into effect on January 1, 2020.

Epinephrine Administration Act (SB 2889): Provides that a health-care practitioner may prescribe epinephrine pre-filled syringes for authorized entities. Pharmacists may dispense epinephrine pre-filled syringes to authorized entities. These prescriptions are valid for two years.

Long Term Care Medicaid (SB 2913): Specifies that the Department of Healthcare and Family Services shall serve as the lead agency in expediting the eligibility-determination and enrollment process for Medicaid. Specifies that the Department of Healthcare and Family Services, the Department of Human Services, and the Department of Aging "take all necessary steps to" meet federal timeframes. These steps include the simplification of the financial eligibility verification process for patients who have had a full Medicaid case active for six or more months and who have not transferred assets within the past five years.

DCEO Utilities EPA Water (SB 3080): The bill establishes a low-income water assistance program.

Abolish Farmers Market Task Force (SB 3195): This bill abolishes the Farmers' Market Task Force, which had not met in two years.

Requires Lactation Rooms (SB 3503): Requires every facility that houses a circuit court to designate at least one public lactation room by June 1, 2019. The lactation room cannot be in a restroom. The lactation room must include a chair, a table, an electrical outlet, and, where possible, a sink with running water.

Creates Sepsis Task Force (SB 3532): Creates a Sepsis Review Task Force to study sepsis early intervention and prevention.

Flu Vaccine Program (HB 2984): The Department of Public Health may require a local health department with a jurisdiction of more than 500,000 residents to implement an influenza-vaccination program that offers flu vaccinations to its health-care employees. Allows certified local health departments to implement more stringent influenza vaccination policies or programs. Allows the Department of Public Health to adopt rules that provide exceptions for personnel who may be exempt for medical or religious reasons.

Transportation

Tollway Agenda Posting (SB 2291): Requires the Tollway to post an agenda for each Board of Directors meeting on the Tollway's website and at

headquarters building at least 2 business days in advance of the meeting. Any agenda must set forth the general subject matter of any issue that will be the subject of final action and include specific details concerning contracts for projects over \$100,000.

Multi-year Vehicle Registration (SB 2293): Requires Secretary of State to offer each owner of first and second division vehicles under 8,000 lbs. the option to register their vehicle for one or two years. Also requires SOS to offer an option to register new vehicles for one, two, or five years. The vehicle owner would pay a one-time fee with the price based on how many years they choose.

Back-up Lights (SB 2511): Provides that a back-up lamp equipped on a motor vehicle shall emit a white or amber light without glare.

Truck Inspection (SB 2558): Allows civilian employees of ISP to write tickets pertaining to excess size and weight permits.

ISP Plates (SB 2585): Provides that permanent vehicle registration plates shall be issued to vehicles owned and used by the Illinois State Police at no charge.

Rental Car Damage Waiver (SB 2641): Provides that a rental car company may void a damage waiver if damage or loss occurs to the rental vehicle when the rental vehicle is stolen and the renter fails to:

1. return the rental vehicle's ignition key and key tag identifying the rental vehicle to the rental company;
2. file a police report within the 24-hour period after discovery of the rental vehicle theft; and
3. fully cooperate with the rental company, law enforcement agency, or any other authority in all matters connected to the investigation of the stolen rental vehicle.

Tow Truck Plate Penalty (SB 3010): States that any person that does not attach a "tow truck" plate to the front and rear of their towing vehicle or attach a "tow truck" plate to a towed vehicle when required is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor.

First Responder Electronic Device (SB 3024): Provides that a first responder, while operating his or her own personal motor vehicle, can use an electronic

communication device for the sole purpose of receiving information about an emergency situation while in route to performing his or her official duties.

Distinct Plate for Covered Farm Vehicles (SB 3241): Provides that the Secretary of State shall issue distinctive registration plates for covered farm vehicles. Provides that a \$10 surcharge shall be collected, in addition to all applicable fees for the issuance of a registration plate.

Vehicle Wheel Fines (SB 3266): Amends the Unified Code of Corrections. Reduces fines for vehicle wheel and axle loads and gross weight limit violations in the Illinois Vehicle Code by reducing the following:

- For the first \$330 in fines, the surcharge rate will be \$15 per \$40 of fines.
- For any subsequent amount above \$330 the surcharge fee will be reduced to \$10 per \$40 of fines.

Veterans' Affairs

Vets Home Member Funds Expenditure (SB 3191): Amends the Dept. Veterans' Affairs Act. Allows the Department to make expenditures from the Members benefits funds of Illinois Veterans' Homes for recognition and appreciation programs for volunteers who assist the Veterans' homes.

Gold Star Family Weekend (SB 3192): Amends the State Commemorative Dates Act; Gold Star Days. Changes Gold Star Family Day designation to the day before Gold Star Mothers' Day (last Sunday in September) allowing for a Gold Star Weekend remembrance/observation.

Veteran' Home Spouse Admissions (SB 3193): Amends the Dept. of Veterans' Affairs Act; Veterans Home Admissions. Provides that a non-veteran spouse shall have the same priority as a veteran of admission to a veterans home if the spouse and his or her veteran spouse are admitted at the same time to live together at the veterans' home. Makes corroborative changes to admittance for Veterans' Homes at Anna and Quincy.

Veterans' Home Disease Notification (SB 3301): Amends the Dept. of Veterans' Affairs Act by adding a new section on infectious disease

notification. Provides that if a Veterans' home administrator or staff is notified within one month or less that two more home residents are diagnosed with an infectious disease, then, within 24 hours the Veterans' home must:

- provide written notification to each resident and their emergency contact or next of kin
- post notification in a conspicuous place near the main entrance
- provide written notification to the IL Dept. of Vets Affairs (IDVA) and IL Dept. of Public Health (IDPH)

The Veterans' home must provide written notification of any updates on the infectious disease and any options that are available to the residents. The IDVA and IDPH must post notifications, updates, and options as soon as possible but no later than the next business day on their respective websites.
